The normal application deadlines are as follows:

- For the Autumn term and full year, the deadline is 30 July
- For the Spring/Summer term Study Abroad option, the deadline is 15 November
- For the Spring/Summer term Study Abroad + internship option, the deadline is 15 October

Please note these are subject to change.

### Language requirements

Our English Language requirement is higher grades at CEFR Level B2, or IELTS 6.0 for Undergraduates and IELTS 6.5 for Postgraduates. We can accept IELTS certificates, university and college transcripts, and reference letters from tutors as evidence of your English language level.

### Term dates 2023/24

#### Autumn term

Arrival and Welcome Week: 22 September – 29 September 2023

Term: 2 October – 15 December 2023

#### Spring/Summer term

Welcome Week: 8 January – 14 January 2024 (tbc)

Term: 15 January – 14 June 2024

*Teaching finishes at the end of the spring term on 22 March 2023. There is then a break for Easter, and the summer term begins on 2 May 2023 and runs until 23 June 2023. If students take modules that are assessed by exams, then they are required to be on campus in the summer term to sit these. If students choose modules that are assessed by essays/coursework, then this can usually be submitted online remotely so students can leave campus at the end of teaching in April.*

#### Full year

Arrival and Welcome Week: 22 September – 29 September 2023

Term: 2 October – 14 June 2024

### Modules

The module options available to incoming Study Abroad students at Goldsmiths can be found here: <https://www.gold.ac.uk/studyabroad/module-options/>. Please note that these options are subject to change.

Students can only select modules from across different departments except for Fine Art and Design. Students wishing to study Fine Art can only study Fine Art modules and must study for a full year. Those wishing to study Design can study for a semester but can only select Design modules.

Module selection takes place via an online form, which is sent to autumn and full year students in July and to spring/summer students in November. Students are required to complete this form to select their modules.

Undergraduate students generally study 4 modules per term. This equates to 60 Goldsmiths credits (30 ECTS).

### Internship programme

Combine study with work on our Study Abroad + Internship Programme delivered in partnership with Arcadia University. On this programme you will complete three Goldsmiths modules at Goldsmiths alongside a London based credit-bearing internship delivered by Arcadia.

You can choose from hundreds of Goldsmiths modules in the spring semester, offered across our academic departments. All teaching for the modules takes place in the spring semester from January to the end of March/beginning of April, with assessment between April and June.

The internship is seven weeks in length and takes place in the summer semester from April to May after the teaching for the modules ends. Internships are full-time hours, 3-4 days per week, and are worth four US credits. You will complete an accompanying internship seminar, Work in Thought and Action, taught by Arcadia University London Centre. The seminar is designed to maximise your learning from the internship experience, and will connect it to both your course of study and your career aspirations. There are 12 contact hours for the seminar, and you will be required to complete assignments.
